

### Voluntary Recall of LANCORA 5 mg - DIN 02459973 - Batches 766141, 769518

RELEASE: Servier Canada has initiated a voluntary Type III recall from wholesalers for 2 batches of LANCORA 5 mg (ivabradine tablets) as indicated in the table below. This recall is being conducted due to the presence of partial tablets in the blisters. To date, no relevant reports of adverse events have been received for these 2 batches.

LANCORA is indicated for the treatment of stable chronic heart failure with reduced left ventricular ejection fraction ( $\leq 35\%$ ) in NYHA Class II or III adult patients in sinus rhythm and whose resting heart rate is  $\geq 77$  beats per minute, in order to reduce the incidence of cardiovascular mortality and hospitalizations for worsening heart failure. LANCORA® must be administered in combination with standard heart failure treatments. Treatment with LANCORA® should be initiated, and the dose increased, under the supervision of a physician experienced in the treatment of patients with heart failure (see Product Monograph).
